Cornice fall triggered slide in Sunlight Basin

Another day of warm temps and clear skies allowed us to cover a lot of ground in the Southern Madisons. We rode into the Taylor Fork, up to the weather station, to the top of Carrot Basin, through Sage Basin, up and over into Cabin Creek, and all the way up to the head of Red Canyon.

We spotted a few old avalanches. <u>One in Cabin Creek</u> that was triggered two days ago by snowmobilers on a N facing <u>aspect</u>. At the top of Carrot Basin, we saw a small avalanche (R1-D1) on a N <u>aspect</u> that likely broke yesterday on buried weak layers. We also spotted one <u>cornice</u>-fall triggered (R2-D2) avalanche that broke earlier this week in Sage Basin and then an older <u>cornice</u> fall triggered <u>slab</u> in Sunlight Basin.
